# Northville-Placid Trail celebrates 100 years (NPT100.com)

Outdoor enthusiasts, and especially those who love to hike, will be able to take part in the <u>100th-anniversary celebration</u> of the Northville-Placid Trail with a hike of their own. This 138-mile trail winds its way through some of the most beautiful and remote areas of the Adirondack Park between Northville NY and Lake Placid NY. Those who attempt to complete the entire route, over many days, can take refuge in numerous lean-tos along the way; while re-stocking their supplies in the small villages adjacent to particular sections of the route.

#### Hamlets to Huts - NPT100 hikes

Adirondack Hamlets to Huts offers guided and self-guided community-based hut-to-hut hiking and paddling routes throughout the Adirondacks that link the region's communities with daytime adventure and nighttime comfort. The group is offering a guided, supported hike of the Northville-Placid Trail in July for those interested in an immersive experience. This unique offering is designed to commemorate the milestone anniversary. Participants can choose to hike the entire length of the trail or may opt to do one or two of the four-day Sections - the hikes include the opportunity to hike with knowledgeable guides while enjoying shuttle services, traditional lodging at select locations, glamping, luggage transfer and other excursion logistics managed by the Hamlets to Huts organization. 47 Main Street, Saranac Lake | 315-657-1320

ADKX Northville Lake Placid Trail Exhibit - The ADKX is celebrating the 100th anniversary of the trail with a temporary exhibition featuring works from the museum's art, photo, guidebook, and map collections, connecting those to objects and artifacts from the museum's permanent collection. Visitors will learn about the history of the trail, the team who built it, particularly Edwin Noyes and Howard Rowe, people who lived along the trail's path, and the trail as it is used today. The exhibit will connect hikers, history buffs, and those who simply treasure the region to come together to mark this anniversary.

<u>Rally North America</u> - The organization is hosting its 2024 Sunshine Rally (July 8-9), benefitting Camp Sunshine. The event begins in Syracuse, New York, and travels through the Adirondacks from Old Forge to Lake Placid and across Lake Champlain; ultimately ending at Camp Sunshine. The group will be driving through the best backroads that New York, Vermont, New Hampshire, and Maine have to offer, with a scavenger hunt along the way. The televised event is a fundraiser for Camp Sunshine, with 80 cars expected.

**UCI Mountain Bike Series event** - Top cycling athletes will compete in a world mountain biking event at Mount Van Hoevenberg in Lake Placid over three days in September 2024. This venue will be one of 10 worldwide sites of the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI) Mountain Bike World Series; and one of six new sites for the competition. <u>www.lakeplacidmtb.com</u>

Lake Placid Ironman - This event celebrates 25 years as the longest-running Ironman race in the US aside from Kona's Ironman World Championship, Ironman Lake Placid is one of the most recognizable events in triathlon. Established in 1999, the legendary race celebrates its 25th anniversary in July 2024. It begins with a 2.4-mile swim across the pristine Mirror Lake, followed by a 112-mile bike course that winds its way through the Adirondack Mountains, and concludes with a 26.2-mile run course that goes through the Olympic village and along the shore of Mirror Lake, offering a flat and fast finish at the iconic Olympic Oval. Fort Ticonderoga commemorates 250 years since the battle for independence. The national 250th commemoration of the American War for Independence will take place from 2024-27, and Fort Ticonderoga will begin its programs, events and other commemorative plans. # Attractions

<u>High Falls Gorge</u> - This beloved natural attraction has a newly improved section of its trail network that is accessible for all. This trail allows for outings and views along one of the most beautiful sections of the attraction, past four of the main waterfalls and through its wooded areas.

Adirondack Rail Trail - The Adirondack Rail Trail is being built on the old New York Central railroad line - these miles of former rail line, between Lake Placid and Tupper Lake, are being converted into a multi-use recreation trail with restored train service south of Tupper Lake and a multi-use trail from Tupper Lake to Lake Placid. The Adirondack Rail Trail will be one of the nation's premier, year-round recreation trails for bicyclists, runners, walkers, birders, and wheelchair users, as well as for snowmobiles in winter. Construction on this route is underway with the first phase complete, connecting Lake Placid to Saranac Lake. Phase 2, linking Saranac Lake with Lake Clear, will begin in 2024 and the final phase from Lake Clear to Tupper Lake will be complete in 2025.
